Snowmobiler's Code of Ethics

1. I will be a good sports enthusiast. I recognize that people judge all snowmobile owners by my actions. I will use my influence with other snowmobile owners to promote fair conduct.

2. I will not litter trails or camping areas. I will not pollute streams or lakes.

3. I will not damage living trees, shrubs, or other natural features. I will go out only when there is sufficient snow so I will not damage the land.

4. I will respect other people's property and rights.

5. I will lend a helping hand when I see someone in distress.

6. I will make myself and my vehicle available to assist search and rescue parties.

7. I will not interfere with or harass hikers, skiers, snowshoers, ice anglers, or other winter sports enthusiasts. I will respect their rights to enjoy the recreational trails.

8. I will know and obey all local, state, and federal laws regarding the operation of snowmobiles in areas where I use my vehicle. I will inform public officials when using public lands.

9. I will not harass wildlife; I will avoid areas posted for the protection or feeding of wildlife.

10. I will stay on marked trails or marked roads for snowmobiles. I will not snowmobile where prohibited.

All trails are marked with approved IDNR signage. The Prairie Riders Snowmobile Club supports the Safety Education Program and can provide more information on classes upon request. Certification of completion of this program is required by the IDNR for children 12 to 15 years of age to legally operate a snowmobile. This certification is also required regardless of age if you were born after 1985.

Member Benefits

Permission from landowners to legally ride 40+ miles of trails going over both private and public land and connecting to other club's trails.

Reciprocal agreement with neighboring clubs giving legal access to 500+ miles of trails going in each direction and into the Wisconsin trail system.

Unlimited use of snowmobile trails provided there is at least 4" of snow on them.

Participation in all club trips, fundraisers, and social events.

Membership in the Illinois Association of Snowmobile Clubs (IASC).

Most of the land in this area is privately owned. A lot of work has gone into obtaining landowners permission to put trails on their property. This permission can be revoked at any time. Stay on the trail or stay home. One person off trail for a few minutes can destroy years of work, miles of trail, and is illegal. IF YOU TRESPASS, YOU WILL BE REPORTED TO LAW ENFORCEMENT! You can be sued for trespassing and damages by the property owner. We build, mark, and maintain snowmobile trails not only for the convenience and safety of our club, but also for neighboring clubs and for all snowmobile enthusiasts. You ride them at your own risk and only if you abide by the Snowmobilers Code of Ethics.
